Other news and items!

From November on into the new year, holidays are everywhere. And so are Therapy Dogs of Vermont wonderful teams/members. Thank You! Especially during this time of seasonal change. TDV wishes all our members and their most beautiful dogs (and family too) a wonderful wrap to 2023 and start to 2024.

Now with the "in case you did not know" category, or "update" category:

TDV has a crisis response program (CRP). The program was launched in 2018; in 2019 we certified eleven (11) teams. Then Covid came along and the program was dormant. Now, in 2023, the program has been brought to the forefront and is being re-developed. We have established a working committee of volunteers (thank you!!). In January we will work to finalize the new process of becoming certified as a Crisis Response Team (CRT). When the process is finalized, it will be presented to membership, through email and updated on the TDV website in the members resources section. Please stay tuned!!

It may be helpful to give a framework to how the program works. CRT members do not self-arrange visits. TDV CRT members respond following an invitation from state or municipal or facility coordinator invitation through our website and CRP telephone number, following a significant crisis event or incident. When TDV is invited, there is criteria and structure to the protocols set by varying agencies or entities. CRT members have completed training and are knowledgeable of these protocols. Another factor to the program is, we recognize that it is not for everyone. If/when the time comes, you're interested, we will work closely with you to determine the best course.
