
PRELIMINARY STEPS TO CREATE TDV'S THIRD DECADE INITIATIVE FOCUSING ON VETERANS

As you may be aware, one of the five organizational goals to flow from TDV's 2011 strategic planning process was to "Identify Therapy Dogs of Vermont's Third Decade Initiative." Since those five organizational goals were formally adopted in March 2012, the TDV Board has unanimously voted to focus this initiative on Veterans and at its December 5th meeting adopted an overall action plan for TDV in 2013 containing a process to make this Third Decade Initiative a reality by 2014.



Over the last ten months, TDV has been creating relationships with veteran organizations and organizations serving veterans and, as a short-term result, we a



This relationship-building effort will continue and we plan to convene a Third Decade Initiative Summit in early June to bring together inside and, most especially, outside TDV folks to prepare a list of recommendations to guide the TDV Board and Executive Director in moving forward to create and adopt a fundable and sustainable program to serve Veterans.

It is our hope to provide an update for the TDV membership at our 2013 TDV Annual Membership Meeting which will again take place at Shelburne Museum Goes to the Dogs in September.

Our timeline calls for TDV Board action on a comprehensive plan at their December 2013 Board Meeting.

A MEMBER'S STORY

In the Autumn Newsletter, we printed Pat Perry's story about the amazing accomplishments of her truly special companion and therapy dog, Sasha. Just prior to its publication, we learned of the loss of this extraordinary dog. Below is her obituary which was submitted to the Plattsburg, NY Press Republican.

The 11-year-old German Shepherd and her owner/mother, Patricia Perry, were regular Sunday morning visitors to CVPH Medical Center, brightening the day for both young and old, patients and families. Sasha was always willing to dress for any occasion and led the hospital's Halloween parade for many years. She also donned bunny ears and a tail for the children's Easter egg hunt on the hospital lawn.

Certified through Therapy Dogs of Vermont, Sasha and Pat attended the Shelburne Museum Goes to the Dogs event every year to promote the work of TDV. In 2011, she took the grand prize, dressed as part of a Native American Village with the help of two young friends.

Just weeks before being diagnosed with cancer, she participated in this year's event, winning second place in the Olympic sport category.

On many occasions, Pat and Sasha would fulfill special requests to visit people in nursing and hospice homes. Last year, they made several trips to Vermont to visit a terminal patient who once had a German Shepherd and wanted to see one for the final time.

Although Sasha always received quality care from Champlain Valley Veterinary Services, she developed an incurable blood vessel cancer. It took great strength and deep love for Pat to let her go.

She received a thorough vet exam yesterday and thankfully was pronounced healthy. She's become my shadow and is quite the go getter, but very sweet. She's a sweetie and very mellow.
